1. INTRODUCTION

BEML Limited, a leading Multi-technology and multi location, 'Miniratna- Category -1 company under the Ministry of Defence for manufacturing a wide range of mining, earthmoving, railways and Defence Truck & Equipment.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

BEML intends to implement standard enterprise wide IR4.0 (Industrial Revolution) Solution across its shopfloor at BEML H&P Division for proposed initial 25 Machines & 02 Test Rigs to start with, including but not limited to real time plant monitoring, digital quality inspection, tracking equipment performance, predicting equipment failure and continuous replenishment. IR4.0 should enable obtaining better, real time information about equipment status and performance and improve operations by providing insights using analytics that will help support and automate the decision-making process.

BEML seeks a comprehensive solution that can integrate well with its existing equipment and software and can leverage existing equipment as much as possible. The IR4.0 platform should serve as a single source of truth, compiling data from equipments such as, CNCs, PLCs, Sensors, SCADA systems and other structured and unstructured data sources across the organization and provide analytics and visualization capabilities. Based on requirements from divisions and identified use cases, in future there may be a requirement to install additional sensors, establish network connectivity, and provide advanced analytics and visualization capabilities. However, the IR4.0 platform shall support data import and export to enable all such future use cases.

This tender document defines the scope of work for development, deployment and subsequent maintenance of:

- A. Enterprise-wide Digital Thread.
- B. Historical Data Storage for factories and supporting infrastructure.

- D. Digital Work Instruction Utilizing existing drawings and Converting to 3D based for digital work instructions, servicing, marketing use cases.

BEML invites proposals from prospective vendors with expertise and track record of success in Design, Development, Implementation and Sustenance of Industry 4.0 (IR4.0) tools, technology, applications and solutions for various data sources not limiting

to CNC machines, PLCs, SCADA systems from heterogenous makes and models such as not limiting to FANUC and SIEMENS controls.

The successful bidder shall provide end-to-end solution to be hosted at BEML's private cloud (Data Center). The bidder shall also help BEML maintain the supplied solution at their DR site as well, for their Business Continuity Plan (BCP) as and when a DR server is procured by BEML.

The IP / Source Code / Work / analytical models /dashboards created / written by the successful bidder over the product, for the proper implementation of the solution, would be the property of BEML and no claim whatsoever can be made by the bidder on the same. The bidder shall also ensure that no BEML specific information acquired by them directly or indirectly as a part of this project shall be shared with an external third party.

Scope of work and Detailed Technical specifications:

The project covers the following main areas:

- 1. Setup of a standardized enterprise-wide data management platform to capture, store and process IT and OT data, and other structured data from sources across H&P, BEML.
- 2. Descriptive & Predictive (optional) analytics and dashboarding on the captured data illustrated through:
- 3. Digital Work Instructions for machine operations through adopting latest technologies but not limited to such as Augmented Reality (AR), Industrial Internet of Things (IIOT) etc.
- 4. Development of dashboards for different Senior Management Levels to view relevant KPIs.

Enterprise-wide Digital Thread - Data Acquisition & Analytics for BEML H&P Division:

Currently, data from CNCs, PLCs, existing systems at BEML KGF site is all standalone and in silos. This data is currently captured and stored locally and there is no central data acquisition and monitoring platform. There is a need for a central data acquisition for H&P division. Vendor shall provide this central storage to store historical data which will be hosted on BEML network.

The platform shall support data acquisition from various data sources not limiting to CNC machines, PLCs, SCADA systems from heterogenous makes and models such as not limiting to FANUC and SIEMENS controls, as mentioned in *Annexure 1.*

Historical Data management platform:

The bidder shall provide a historical data management platform that will capture data from:

- 1. Multiple data sources (including the BEML H&P division described above and other divisions at KGF plant for later expansion), without additional cost
- 2. Corporate data sources such as SAP, CRM, PLM etc. (Future Plan)
- 3. Other data sources from divisional headquarters, local offices, and field sites. (List of the type of connectors needed is available in *Annexure 2*).

The said connectors shall support both on demand extraction as well as bulk transfer and storage of the data. The data management platform shall support on-premises of BEML based storage for the purpose of this scope of work. Data from this data management platform will be used for analytics and visualization.

Analytics and visualization applications:

The solution shall support export of data to other third-party applications for analysis and dashboarding, as well as provide the capability to do basic descriptive & predictive analytics and dashboarding. To illustrate this capability, the bidder shall:

a) Implement at least one use case for descriptive and predictive analysis and dashboarding for H&P division in KGF Complex, as described below.

The platform shall be capable and scalable to collect and manage data securely from H&P, Earth Movers, Rail Coach & Heavy Fabrication units and instrument sensors at KGF complex and other manufacturing units spread across India such as from Mysore, Bangalore and Palakkad. The data shall be ingested into the platform for the purpose of analytics. The solution shall monitor the specified parameters and provide descriptive & predictive analytics-based insights on a dashboard.

b) Development of dashboards for senior management to view relevant KPIs

The solution shall create dashboards for the use of the senior management that provide insights on various KPIs which can be measured through analysis of the data collected from the various data sources as mentioned in this document. An indicative list of the KPIs is available in *Annexure 4*.

Following the successful implementation of the solution, and implementation of the use cases defined in this scope of work, BEML would extend the solution's usage beyond what is mentioned in this scope of work by either: a) adding additional sensors and equipment on a use case basis b) adding use case specific analytics and visualization

Annexure - H

Special Conditions arising out of implementation of GST (Which is to be signed and submitted along with the offer) Tax Indemnity clause

- 1. The supplier of Goods / Services shall comply with all the procedural requirements and relevant provisions under GST Law so as to enable BEML Limited (BEML) to avail Input Tax Credit (ITC) in a timely manner. BEML has the right to recover tax loss along with consequential interest and penalty suffered by BEML due to any non-compliance of tax laws by the supplier. Any GST liability arising on the supplier on account of loss of GST credits for reasons such as failure of the supplier to provide the details for raising invoice with necessary particulars, delay in payment of consideration beyond stipulated time period and the interest thereon would be on the suppliers themselves and BEML shall not be liable to compensate the same.
- 2. The supplier shall ensure that the Taxes which have been collected / with-held on behalf of BEML have been duly paid / will be paid to the Government account within the due dates specified under various Tax Laws in India and Rules made there under. It may please be noted that if BEML is not able to avail any tax credit due to any short coming on the part of the supplier (which otherwise should have been available to BEML in the normal course), then the supplier at his own cost and effort will get the short coming rectified. If for any reason the same is not possible, then the supplier will make 'good' the loss suffered by BEML due to the tax credit it lost in that transaction.
